Chair's Report

It has certainly been a very challenging year for community pharmacy. We had been awaiting the cuts to pharmacy funding and on 20th October 2016 the government imposed its actions. These savage cuts put the survival of many community pharmacies at risk of closure.

Since then Avon LPC has put a huge amount of time and resources into educating the contractors about the cuts and supporting them to claim maximum QPS revenue.

I am delighted to say that at the first point of claiming QPS on 28th April 2017 all of our contractors got through the Gateway criteria.

We must not forget that there have been successes to celebrate. The pharmacy flu vaccination service delivered in excess of 18,000 vaccinations across Avon.

As chair of Avon LPC I am very proud of our achievements this year. I would like to thank all committee members for their hard work and support.

Special thanks to Richard Brown, Avon LPC's Chief Officer, Jerry Long the QPS lead, and Judith Poulton HLP project manager and Implementation manager who work tirelessly on behalf of the contractors.




Chief Officers Annual Statement 2016-17

2016-17 has been one of the most challenging for community pharmacy in recent times, however I write this full of pride in the way that pharmacies across Avon have risen to the task.

During the year the Government finally announced the imposition of the new contract and this meant that Avon LPC launched its support programme. We had spent a number of months preparing in the background for this announcement and as such already had our team ready to go. The investment of LPC funds in a Quality Payment Support Manager, (£20,000 per annum) was agreed to support our 230 pharmacies in claiming their share of the £6,400 available (£1.5 million across the LPC). Over 15 workshops have been delivered, countless phone calls and one to one pharmacy visits have occurred all to enable you, the contractor, to maximise your claim. Satisfyingly our own audits show that all of our community pharmacies achieved the gateway questions with over 95% claiming all the twice yearly criteria. This represents a huge success and places our pharmacies in a strong position to claim 100 points by the end of November.

Earlier in the year we also supported you all to deliver an excellent flu vaccination season with over 18,000 patients vaccinated compared with just less than 12,000 in 2015-16. Planning is now underway for the 2017-18 season with face to face vaccination training already organised via Avon Healthcare Services (Avon LPC supported provider company).



We also recognise the important role community pharmacy plays in supporting the Public Health agenda. Across Bristol and South Gloucestershire we have been continuing our Level 2 Healthy Living Pharmacy project. There are now 26 signed off with another 9 in training. These pharmacies are also delivering excellent results on alcohol and weight management interventions. Currently our Bristol weight management programme has led to an average weight loss of 5.88% (5.46kg) per patient for people going via the pharmacy service. This data is now being used to demonstrate the benefit of community pharmacy to other public health commissioners.

This work typifies the approach we have taken across Avon LPC to support all of our pharmacies. We have continued our successful training programme with six clinical topics offered and we will continue to help and support all pharmacies throughout the years to come.

Treasures Report for 2016-2017

To All Contractors in Avon,

Below is a summary of the additional expenditure we had in 2016-17

As we know 2016-17 was a very challenging year for Pharmacy compounded by the Funding Cuts in December 2017, which resulted in an average of £6k per month per contractor.

The Quality Payments Scheme (QPS) was introduced by NHS England and every Pharmacy could earn c£6,400 pa if they achieved all of the QPS criteria.

Avon LPC recognised that to achieve this we have to give support to our contractors so we put a project team together and ran workshops and visited or spoke to every contractor and the indications are that ALL our community contractors achieved the "QPS Gateway" criteria and the average number of points claimed was **50.5** which equates an average of £3,232 per Pharmacy and this is likely to be more like £5000 as each point may be worth c£100

The cost of the QPS lead for 5 months was c£10k plus venue costs etc. which were c£3k

The MUR lead cost cost 10k for 6 months (April – Sept)

The PSNC also asked every LPC to help fund the Judicial Review which they took out against the Government – Avon LPC had to pay <u>c24</u>k and LPC decided to fund this from our cash reserves.



So in total we had unplanned "costs" of £44k

Other things to note:

We received a payment from South Glous Public Health to fund HLP's in 2015-16 but the project started in April 2016.
