### **Chair's Annual Report**

Once again it has been a very challenging year for community pharmacy and yet every team has gone above the call of duty to ensure we deliver the best patient care. What community pharmacy has achieved has been outstanding and I am immensely proud.

I am delighted with the progress that we have made with service delivery. We delivered a staggering ninety thousand flu vaccinations last season. Each month we are delivering over three thousand GP CPCS referrals, one thousand PGDs and momentum is growing with the hypertension case finding service. Being fully engaging with clinical services is imperative in taking our profession forward and gives us the vital evidence to demonstrate our value.

As Chair of Avon LPC, I am very proud once again of what we have achieved. I would like to thank all committee members for their hard work and support.

I am also extremely grateful for all the hard work and dedication shown by the Operations team. Richard Brown (Chief Officer), Judith Poulton (Implementation Manager), Roger Herbert (Pharmacy Support), Barbara Coleman (Primary Care Relationship Manager) and Debbie Scudamore (Engagement Officer), who work tirelessly on behalf of the contractors.

I am very excited about the future especially the opportunities that will present when community pharmacists become independent prescribers. This will give us the clinical role that we so desire. I fully appreciate the challenges involved to achieve this and I assure you that Avon LPC will support you on this journey.

We must remain positive and work together to take our profession forwards and as always Avon LPC will be here to support you each step of the way.

Avon LPC has supported all our contractors to begin the journey to a clinical service based contract. Through the hard work and dedication of the LPC Operations Team (Barbara, Debbie, Judith and Roger) we have supported our pharmacies to deliver over 1,000 PGDs per month, well over 3,000 GP CPCS referrals, over 1,000 NHS111 CPCS referrals along with nearly 90,000 flu vaccinations. Community Pharmacy is now a significant arm of the NHS in delivering services for patients above and beyond our core contract of dispensing.

However, do not under-estimate the importance of the safe supply of medicines that pharmacies provide. This is the foundation of our profession and one that we can build from with additional clinical services. This means we now have pharmacies who are experiencing their pharmacies spending a growing amount of their working day in the consultation room consulting with patients. This is a massive step forward for the profession and one we are replicating across the LPC.

Beyond this, our community pharmacists are now becoming Independent Prescribers with the intention of using the qualification in their community pharmacy as they do not want to work in another sector of the profession to be able to prescribe. It is therefore extremely satisfying to see that in BSW ICB they have commissioned a service specifically for IPs to lead clinics in their pharmacy seeing patients with acute conditions.

This completely aligns with the vision and strategy of the LPC to lead the way in transforming our section from a dispensing and supply led contract to a supply and clinical service-based model. We are on the journey to achieve this, and we will help every one of you achieve this goal when the time is right.

#### Treasurer's Report for 2021-2022

To All Contractors in Avon,

2021/22 was another tough year for community pharmacy as we were still dealing with Covid 19 and the challenges that presented. You all provided amazing support to your patients & communities.

In 2021/22 we saw a number of pharmacies close, along with some mergers and changes of ownership as the larger organisation reviewed their estates.

There are many opportunities coming to improve your service income from more services that the LPC have been working on with commissioners, please ensure you maximise these opportunities.

#### Summary of the 2021/22 Accounts:

I would like to draw your attention to some key points in the accounts across the following pages.

- 1. We received £14,228 more in grants than 2020/21 this was from the NHSE&I to pay for our Implementation Manger to deliver training and support for CPCS. This balanced the overspend on that expenditure
- 2. The costs for the Committee and Chief office are down by £4,000 which in the mainly is due to Zoom meetings along with incurring less travel expenses
- 3. The extra PSNC levy towards the Wright report this year means that when you add together the two lines for PSNC the spend is the same
- 4. The increase expenditure on PharmOutcomes is offset by the additional income from grants
